David Warlick, a 30-year educator, has been an innovator and leader in the field of educational technology. He is a prolific programmer who has been a classroom teacher, a district administrator, and a staff consultant with the North Carolina State Department of Public Instruction. He has written award-winning instructional software and has introduced hundreds of teachers to the educational potentials of personal computers. Since 1995, Warlick has been the owner and principal consultant of The Landmark Project, a professional development and innovations firm in Raleigh North Carolina. During this time David has spoken at conferences and delivered workshops for educators throughout the U.S., Canada, Europe, Asia, The Middle East, and South America. His classroom blogging site, [Class Blogmeister](#), serves more than 100,000 users, and his attribution tool, [Citation Machine](#), receives more than a half-million page views a day.

These and all of his other web tools for teachers are free. Warlick has also written three books about technology and contemporary literacy, and has contributed to other publications including *Technology & Learning Magazine*, *ALA's KnowledgeQuest*, *Education World*, and *CUE Online*, and has been quoted in *Education Week*, *The San Francisco Chronicle*, *The New York Times*, *WashingtonPost*, and *USA TODAY*. ## Kevin L. Smith, JD

**10:45-11:45:** Copyright Issues, Exceptions for Teaching & the Digital Age

Kevin Smith has been the Scholarly Communications Officer at Duke since June, 2006. He began his academic career with graduate work in theology and literature at Yale and the University of Chicago, then obtained a library degree from Kent State University in 1995. He has worked as an academic librarian in both liberal arts colleges and specialized theological libraries. Smith completed a law degree while serving as the library director at Defiance College in Ohio, where he also taught Constitutional law. His legal studies were the culmination of a long-standing interest in intellectual property issues and their relationship to broader legal concerns in higher education. As Duke's first Scholarly Communications Officer, Smith's principle role is to teach and advise faculty, administration and students about copyright, intellectual property licensing and scholarly publishing; he also serves on the University's Intellectual Property Board and gives numerous presentations for faculty and librarians both on campus and around the country. ## Sharon Hawks, RN, MSN, CRNA

**1:40 to 2:10:** E-portfolios in a CRNA Program

Sharon Hawks is Assistant Clinical Professor at Duke University School of Nursing and Associate Program Director for the CRNA specialty. She plans to finish her Doctor of Nursing Practice degree in May 2010.

As a student and teacher, Hawks is very interested in improving distance-based education. At the 2009 iNET conference, she will speak about a project she has begun to work on. This fall the CRNA program will begin to require students to compile an online or E-portfolio instead of a paper-based portfolio. Hawks will talk about the advantages of using an E-portfolio from two

perspectives: 1.) from the perspective of a student or professional who wants to display their work and share information easily with potential employers, and 2.) as an instructor who needs to evaluate students' portfolios of professional practice.

## Debra Barksdale, PhD, FNP-BC, ANP-BC, CNE, FAANP

**2:20 – 2:50:** VoiceThread in Nurse Practitioner Education

Dr. Debra J. Barksdale is an Associate Professor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Nursing (SON) and is certified as both a family and an adult nurse practitioner. She is also a certified nurse educator and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners. She is nationally known for work with nurse practitioner education, diversity, and her research dealing with stress and cardiovascular disease in Black American adults. She chairs the Master's Executive Committee, co-chairs the Graduate Faculty Committee and is a member of the Faculty Development Committee, Research Policy Board, the Ethnic Minority Visiting Scholars Task Force, and the Faculty Executive

Committee in the SON. She is currently a leader in efforts to establish a Doctor of Nursing Practice Program at UNC-CH. She was coordinator of the FNP Program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill for 4 years from 2002 to July, 2006. She is a Department of Health and Human Services Primary Health Care Policy Fellow. Additionally, she was a member of the Board of Directors of the prestigious National Organization of Nurse Practitioner Faculty and chaired the Research and the Capital Development and Marketing Committees. Dr. Barksdale has over 20 years of NP experience and has been a NP in urgent care, primary care, home care and care of the underserved. She was the Administrative Director for Medlantic Med+Care a clinic of the Washington Hospital Center Network in Washington D.C. and Co-Director of Imani, a faith based Nurse Managed Clinic in Detroit Michigan. She currently practices at the Robert Nixon Clinic in Chapel Hill. She has numerous publications, presentations, and abstracts related to her research, diversity, NP education and practice. ## **Sonya Hardin, RN, PhD, CCRN, NP-C**

**1:40-2:10:** The Synergistic Impact of Teaching in Second Life

Dr. Sonya R. Hardin received her PhD from the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, MSN & BSN from the University of NC at Charlotte, MSN/MHA from Pfeiffer University and completed a Post Doc at the University of NC at Chapel Hill in 2006. She is known nationally for her work with the American Association of Critical Care Nurses and has served on numerous task forces for the AACN including those focused on the development of the AACN Synergy Model, the AACN Study of Practice and most recently the task force to revise the Standard of Practice for Critical Care Nursing. She is the co-author of three critical care textbooks titled *Synergy for Clinical Excellence: The AACN Synergy Model for Patient Care*; *Critical Care Nursing: Optimal Patient Outcome* and *Cardiac Surgery Essentials for Critical Care Nursing*. She is a reviewer of manuscripts for *The Journal of Gerontological Nursing* and *Research in Geriatric Nursing*. Over the past 5 years she has co-edited the journal *Visions: The Journal of Rogerian Nursing Science*. Hardin is currently employed as an Associate Professor in the School of Nursing at the University of NC at Charlotte and also works every third weekend at Davis Regional Medical Center in Statesville, NC. As an educator she provides didactic and clinical instruction for both the undergraduate and graduate nursing students. Her experiences include the use of the simulation lab, Second Life (3D Virtual environment) where students submit aesthetic work related to nursing theory in a virtual art gallery on an island that the university rents in Second Life. Her teaching strategies are focused on participatory learning. She has utilized online teaching methods, including BlackBoard, blogs, and wikis. She is the 2008 recipient of the National Teaching Excellence Award from Gannett Health Care, Inc, publisher of *Nursing Spectrum*, and she received a Circle of Excellence Award from the American Association of Critical Care Nurses in 2009.
